NORTHSTAR PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION (NPOA) UPDATE

Tim Fulton provided the following report for NPOA:

TAHOE-TRUCKEE SANITATION AGENCY (T-TSA) UPDATE

General Manager (GM) Mike Geary provided the Board with the following report for T-TSA:

- T-TSA provided District staff with a summary of their recent board meeting
- GM Geary stated the District has long held interest in becoming a member agency and thought it would be beneficial for the Board to be more familiar with their meetings and business.
- GM Geary reviewed the difference between being a member agency and a customer and provided a brief history on why the District is not already a member agency.
- President Radanovich proposed continuing to include the report from T-TSA

NEW BUSINESS

PLACER LAFCO ALTERNATE SPECIAL DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVE SELECTION

Secretary of the Board (SotB) Julie Zangara stated the Placer County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) notified the District of a voting period to select an Alternate Special District Representative. In total, LAFCO received five candidate nominations. Additionally, Scott Wilson of T-TSA contacted the District and directly provided a resume requesting the District consider selecting him as the alternate. Mr. Wilson is the only candidate from the local region.

Director Forni moved to select Scott Wilson as the Placer LAFCO Alternate Special District Representative. Director Brown seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Brown, Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Witherspoon. The motion carried.

WOOD ENERGY FACILITY – SECOND ADDENDUM TO THE MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

Director of Public Works (DPW) Eric Martin stated Dudek drafted a second addendum to the District's Wood Energy System Mitigated Negative Declaration to address the Wood Energy Facility (WEF) project modifications including the replacement of the emissions equipment to ceramic filtration technology, installation of a single, two-megawatt boiler instead of two one-megawatt boilers, and addition of power generation equipment. Staff is requesting the Board adopt the addendum so that a notice of determination may be filed with the state clearinghouse and the Placer County Clerk.

Director Brown moved to approve the Wood Energy Facility – Second Addendum to the Mitigated Negative Declaration. Director Ives seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Brown, Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Witherspoon. The motion carried.

CORPORATE YARD VEHICLE CHARGERS

DPW Martin said the District received a grant in October of 2024 from the Placer County Air Pollution Control District (PCAPCD) providing significant funding for car chargers. The District subsequently filed an application with Liberty Utilities to provide the utility side of a new power service for the chargers. Liberty recently approved the grant and provided an agreement to install the new dedicated power service. The District's operations department staff will perform earthwork for the customer-side installation. Staff is seeking approval of the Liberty Utilities Electric Vehicle Service Extension Agreement and authorization for staff to proceed with electrical vehicle chargers purchases and services for an amount of \$105,856, with \$44,504 to be reimbursed by the PCAPCD grant. In total NCSD is expected to pay \$61,352.

Director Brown moved to approve the Corporate Yard Vehicle Chargers. Director Ives seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Brown, Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Witherspoon. The motion carried.

INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE 40-25 ESTABLISHING FIRE DEPARTMENT FEE SCHEDULES

Fire Chief Jason Gibeaut stated the Northstar Fire Department (NFD) is permitted to charge a fee to cover the cost of any service the District provides or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee is charged, provided that no fee exceeds the cost reasonable borne by the District. The NFD is seeking to update the fee schedule to more accurately reflect the cost of any service for which the fee is charged. Changes to fee schedules are made via ordinance and require a formal introduction of the Ordinance to the Board and public. After consideration of a motion to waive further reading of the ordinance, the Board may direct counsel to draft a summary of the ordinance for publication, and the SotB to publish said summary per the requirements of Government Code Section 25124.

Director Ives moved to waive further reading of Proposed Ordinance 40-25 Establishing Fire Department Fee Schedules and Designated the District Secretary and General Counsel to Prepare and Publish the Summary Meeting Requirements of Government Code Section 25124. Director Brown seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Brown, Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Witherspoon. The motion carried.

APPROVAL TO PURCHASE A NEW NORTHSTAR FIRE DEPARTMENT VEHICLE

Chief Gibeaut stated the NFD is seeking Board approval to replace one of its current utility vehicles routinely used by the NFD's Chief. The vehicle in question has experienced mechanical issues and two independent mechanics have stated the engine needs to be replaced. The NFD seeks to replace its vehicles every 10 to 15 years and the vehicle scheduled to be replaced was manufactured in 2009/2010. The capital purchase of the replacement vehicle has been budgeted for Fiscal Year 2025-26. The cost and outfitting of the vehicle are not expected to exceed the cost budgeted. A state contract is available for a Chevrolet Silverado 2500 Pickup through Winner Chevrolet, who won the government bid for the vehicle.

Director Forni moved to approve the Purchase a New Northstar Fire Department Vehicle for an amount not to exceed \$100,000. Director Ives seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Brown, Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Witherspoon. The motion carried.

- Met with the new Vail General Manager to detail the District's relationship with the resort

FIRE DEPARTMENT - GIBEAUT

Chief Gibeaut provided the following report:

- Fire Prevention Officer (FPO) Brandon Olk is diligently working on the update to the Fire Code along with three other regional fire departments.
- Decrease in staffing due to fiscal constraints is causing Station 32 to be closed more frequently.
- Commendation ceremony held to honor the young resident who called 911 which helped lead to the apprehension of the suspected arsonist.
- President Radanovich, GM Geary, and Chief Gibeaut received a letter from a resident stating the NFD's efforts recently saved his life during a cardiac event.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT - MARTIN/EVANS

DPW Martin and Utilities Operations Supervisor (UOS) Shaun Evans provided the following report:

- DPW Martin stated the transition from Utility Operations Manager (UOM) Matt Ryan to UOS Evans is well underway. UOS Evans was reintroduced to the Board.
- UOS Evans provided the Board with his background of working for the District
- Operations crew is working on trail maintenance following recent wave of storms
- Northstar Water System Well production in July was decreased due to the Golf Course using much of their own water.
- Bridge abutments for Martis Valley Trail Segment 3F are currently being constructed
